Message from our Chair

This past year, The North East Educational Foundation (NEEF) had many successes worth acknowledging and celebrating. Our Board of Directors, business partners, parents, and volunteers continue to show up and support NEEF, which I am incredibly thankful for. It is an honor to begin my 6th year on the NEEF board alongside many wonderfully committed board members who share the same passion for NEISD.

During the 2022-2023 fiscal year, NEEF raised over \$125,000 for Big Give. Lopez Middle School, Encino Park Elementary School, and Tejeda Middle School were our big winners, raising \$33,000 between the three of them. Thank you to the parents for advocating for your school and making this a success.

Another massive accomplishment for NEEF was our Fund-A-Need for a 50 ft rappel tower to be constructed at Camp Henson and completed in the spring of 2024. The rappel tower will not only benefit our 900 JROTC students but will open opportunities for all of our students to benefit from team building and confidence building. Big Give - NEISD Leaders

For the 2022 Big Give, NEISD schools helped us surpass our goal by 15% to raise \$126,986. Among the 396 participating Big Give SA fundraisers, NEEF achieved 1st place for the number of donors (1,401) and 6th on the leaderboard for the total dollar amount raised. Gala

Our organization's most significant fundraising event is the Boots, Bling, and Big Dreams Gala, which raised \$361,861. It included a silent and live auction, grant showcases, performances, as well as a Fund-A-Need. The success of the gala was made possible by the generous contributions of our Board and sponsors, including the Gordon Hartman Family Foundation. This year's Gala will occur on March 2, 2024 at Pedrotti's Ranch.



Team NEISD Employee and Community Giving

Team NEISD is our employee and community giving campaign. Employees can make monthly contributions through a payroll deduction. Through employee giving, NEEF provided \$43,000 to campuses. Our incredible employees and community who contribute to Team NEISD support projects like robotics clubs, mental health initiatives, and community gardens.





This year's Fund-A-Need raised over \$100K for a 50-foot Rappel Tower at NEISD's Camp Henson. While the tower is being built by the JROTC department. It will be utilized by other NEISD programs, staff, and students to help them gain confidence, build trust, leadership skills and more.

MEEF Grants in Action

CTEC "EMT Ambulance Simulator"

Walter Pearson was thrilled to use the \$51,000 grant to purchase an ambulance simulator with a full-size ambulance patient compartment where students can conduct realistic simulations for medical and trauma patients.







Oak Meadow Elementary

Gifted and Talented Teacher, Mary Koudelka used the \$9,574 to buy equipment for virtual reality learning. "We are taking what the students are learning off the page and into the VR headsets to solidify what they are learning about."



Pre-K Academy

This grant supports the Culinary, Health Education for Families initiative. Educators have purchased a mobile culinary cart that is equipped with various small appliances, measuring cups, and books. This enables students to cook and learn about essential nutrition.





DATA at Roosevelt

Paul Fritz used the \$42,688 grant to build a production studio with state of the art equipment, industry used software, and a Cyclorama green screen. Students from varying programs including, art, computer science, film and more, collaborate and make videos and video games.





Vineyard Ranch Elementary

Librarian Melissa Barnes and Dyslexia Specialist, Morgan Hill used \$6,705 to purchase Wonderbooks that are specifically designed for early readers, struggling readers, or any students who simply want a read-along audiobook.



Madison High School

Lynn Rice has created a thriving garden to reinforce "ALE Life Skills." The garden includes raised beds, outdoor furniture, and a shed. Students learn about growing food, nutrition, and collaboration, as well as real-life skills like entrepreneurship and business.
